## Brief History

On Thanksgiving Day 1917, Billy Shelper, a downtown Bloomington candy store owner and self-professed alcoholic, began Home Sweet Home Rescue Mission. Shelper had attended a tent revival meeting led by famed evangelists Billy Sunday and Mel Trotter ten years earlier and was led to salvation. Soon he began a ministry in the McLean County Jail.

Shelper spent the next 35 years working tirelessly to spread the message of salvation to everyone who entered the doors of the Mission. People could count on “Uncle Billy” for a hot meal and a Bible. Shelper and his volunteers served meals and provided clothing, sewing classes, devotions, church services, and even crutches during the polio epidemic. Several strong leaders followed in Shelper’s footsteps. Rev. Dale E. McKain recognized the need to have a highly organized and focused organization in order to serve as many people as possible. The leadership of the Mission rose to the ever-increasing needs in the community.

Over time the Home Sweet Home City Rescue Mission grew from a simple shelter in a downtown Bloomington storefront to a building at 303 E. Oakland Avenue. After suffering a fire in 1978, Home Sweet Home rebuilt with the help and support of the local community.

Home Sweet Home Ministries, as it is known today, thrives on the support of the community through fundraising and volunteerism. The Women’s Auxiliary has supported several successful initiatives, including the Recycling and Distribution Center which evolved into the Mission Mart store. Home Sweet Home Ministries still provides food for the hungry and shelter for the homeless. Several new programs including the Threshold Education Program continue to help support those in need.

## Scope

This collection is the result of combining the original collection (newspaper clippings, histories of the Mission, Women’s Auxiliary Reports, and newsletters from the previous museum collection) with a large donation from Home Sweet Home Ministries (additional newspaper clippings; further materials from the Women’s Auxiliary, including a scrapbook; additional newsletters; and essays on the history of its founder Billy Shelper and the Mission itself). The collection also contains organizational materials on the operation of the mission, including fundraising materials, information on various programs, and departments. A large assortment of photographs are in this collection, although many remain unidentified.
