Brief History

The Young Men’s Club (YMC) is a unique organization in the Bloomington-Normal community. As reported in the YMC 100th year anniversary book, the club began when, “a guy at *The Daily Bulletin* . . . asked his boss if he could join Rotary.” The guy’s boss said there were too many old men in Rotary and he would be better off if he started his own club. He did just that! W.H. “Bill” Gronemeier talked with his friends who supported the idea, which led to the first meeting on October 24, 1916, at the Hills Hotel in downtown Bloomington

They originally decided that one man per business could join and must be no older than 40 years of age. The maximum membership would be 75 and the Club would meet every Tuesday at 12 noon. On December 31, 1918, the Club adopted a constitution and by-laws, as well as a club motto: “Boost for each other and boost for Bloomington [later changed to community].” The founders promoted a relaxed, informal atmosphere that resulted in a “fun loving group” where members could relax, laugh, have fun, and develop lasting friendships. This tradition continues today as shown in friendly heckling of officers and members. The YMC was a success as the 75-member limit was lifted and within the first year it was reported the club turned down requests to join with Lions, Rotary, Optimists, and Kiwanis. To this day the club remains completely local

and is not affiliated with a state or national organization. Membership consists of local businessmen and professionals, including many retirees, some who have belonged for 50 years or more.

While there is little recorded history in this collection from the 1920s thru the 1970s, there is no doubt the YMC continued to thrive as shown in the social events and anniversary celebrations, e.g., 25th (1941), 40th (1956), 50th (1966), and 60th (1976). During this time period, *The Pantagraph* newspaper contained numerous references to YMC member participation in community events, e.g., banquet to honor G. J. Mecherle (founder of State Farm Insurance), supporting youth at Victory Hall (a home for boys in Normal), and hosting an event for Vietnam veterans.

Club traditions over the years include golf outings, ladies' night's out, holiday parties at the Bloomington Country Club, Changing of the Guard, hoaxes, etc. Some of the better-known hoaxes include the Bus Trip to Nowhere, the Russian Count, and most recently a Social Security official who spoke on reduced benefits. Club members have developed and presented several "follies" programs (community fundraising events). Lastly, the organization continues its long tradition of supporting young people through Youth Opportunity Foundation grants to individuals and organizations which presently includes the Challenger Learning Center, Boys and Girls Club of Bloomington, and the McLean County Museum of History's Futures in History Camp.

The YMC continues to meet every Tuesday noon. The president presides at these meetings, makes announcements, always has a humorous story, and introduces the program speaker. The wide variety of weekly programs provides an opportunity to learn more about the Bloomington-Normal community. The newsletters usually contain a summary of these programs and photographs are posted weekly on the YMC Facebook pages.

Through its history, the spirit of relaxed fellowship has made the Young Men's Club a unique organization in the Bloomington-Normal community while continuing to adhere to its original motto: Being a boost for each other and for the Community.

### **Acknowledgements**

This collection resulted from the contributions of Club members over many years. While it is impossible to name everyone who contributed, we are grateful for their foresight to save these materials which tell the story of the Young Men's Club (YMC) and its contributions to the community. However, we do know that all or almost all of the audiovisual (AV) recordings were filmed by Rogers Freedlund. Without Rogers work there would be few AV materials. These recordings provide a unique insight into the past culture of the YMC. We are eternally grateful to Rogers.

This project began in July 2022 when YMC President Wayne Kissler formally transferred ownership of the YMC documents to the McLean County Museum of History (MCMH) and established a History Committee consisting of Wayne H. Ericson (chair), Robert Fisher, and Jim Stahly. Dan Holder, Chair of the Youth Opportunity Foundation (YOF) Board, transferred the YOF documents in late 2023. Work began on the development of the collection and Finding Aid in March 2023. At the outset we knew little about archiving, organizing and cataloguing a collection, and creating a Finding Aid. We are grateful for the guidance provided by MCMH Librarian Bill Kemp and Archivist George Perkins. Their patience and thoughtful comments throughout this process were much appreciated.

The YMC leadership (Presidents Wayne Kissler, Gary Blakney, Frank Hoffman, and Boards) were very supportive e.g., reviewing proposed finding aid categories, discussing materials to include/exclude, obtaining paper copies of "The Cow Bell," updating AV files, and replacing an external hard drive. Herb Knudsen, Jim Stahly, and Greg Koos participated in these discussions. Wayne Kissler organized several years of YMC Cow Bell newsletters.

One of the most daunting tasks was what to do with the one-half box of old photographs, many of which had no identifying information. Luckily there were five men who have been members for 50 years or more!! These "Golden Oldies" are Gary Blakney, William Caisley, Fred Groves, Dan Holder, and Stan Jarecki. They met several times and identified many photographs that are now in the collection. Fred Noyes and Jerry Kownacki joined the group for the last two sessions.

As the collection was being organized the opportunity arose to "fill in" gaps in the materials, e.g., lists of weekly meetings, annual reports, Ladies Night Out, etc. Herb Knudsen supplied many of the needed records. Fred Noyes provided documents used in planning the 100th Anniversary celebration. Wayne Kissler supplied lists of weekly programs.

Much time was spent updating AV files. When external hard drive #1 failed, lost data was retrieved when Dan Holder provided a back-up drive and approval was given to purchase a replacement. Gary Blakney sought out and acquired the services of a company to convert VHS tapes to DVD's and e-files. Club Photographer Robert E. Handley helped identify and implemented procedures to convert "Cow Bell" e-files to a format that permitted the records to be reproduced on paper for storage in the collection. He spent many hours converting DVDs and e-files to a common format so they could be viewed on different computers. Jim Stahly organized and updated external hard drive #2 which, among other items, contains a listing of weekly meeting descriptions/photographs (2000 thru 2024) from Facebook pages managed by Robert E. Handley.

Lastly, I am grateful to Robert Fisher who spent numerous Monday afternoons in the Museum, as well as time at home processing the collection. He made significant contributions to the organization, quality, and completion of the collection and Finding Aid.

Many thanks to everyone who contributed and were dedicated to this project. It will remain in the archives of the McLean County Museum of History for many years to come.
